LEA Parent Involvement Policy, NCLB, 1118(a)

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

The North Shelby School District agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- B. The school district will, with the assistance of its schools, provide materials and training to help parents work with their child to improve their child's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
 - *Hosting PAT Group Connections
 - *Family Literacy Activity
 - *Implementation of Web-based Technology Programs
 - *Open House
- C. The school district will, with the assistance of its schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services, personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

 - *Staff Meetings
- D. The school district will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, the Parents as Teachers program, and public preschool and other programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their child, by:
 - *Maintain open lines of communication with other entities who work with children
 - *Partner with local preschools and Head Start
 - *Develop partnerships with other school/community groups to provide additional learning opportunities for parents.
- E. The school district will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parental involvement programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including

alternative formats upon request, and to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.

Information will be provided in a language that is understandable to parents. F. The school district will provide other reasonable support for parental involvement
